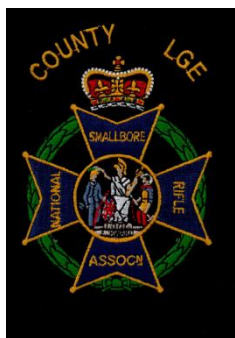

This Booklet describes the Winter competitions available to Counties, and should be read in conjunction with our “County Postal Competitions” booklet and, where appropriate, the NSRA Rules and Regulations. All these documents are available on the NSRA website (www.nsra.co.uk).



Conditions	
Eligibility	A competitor is not required to be a Life, Annual or Associate Member of the NSRA, but must reside in the County they represent.
Format	<p>Team and Individual Competition:</p> <p>Individual competition in stages, progressing to leading individuals in each County forming the County Team of 6 in the 3rd stage and in the final.</p> <p>1st, 2nd and 3rd stages are shot postally. The final is shot at the Bisley Rifle Meeting. Only one team may represent the County in the 3rd stage.</p>
Course of Fire	<p>1st, 2nd and 3rd stages shot at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres. Each competitor must shoot their cards within a single day.</p> <p>1st Stage: - 20 shots deliberate and 20 shots time limit. Counties with under 25 competitors are exempt from this stage. The leading 20 competitors qualify for the 2nd stage.</p> <p>2nd Stage:- Same course of fire as the 1st stage. The leading 6 competitors qualify to represent their County Team in the 3rd stage.</p> <p>3rd Stage:- Same course of fire as the 1st stage. The leading 8 County Teams qualify to shoot in the final. The leading individual in each County Team qualifies for the Individual Competition, shot concurrently with, or at the same time as the Team Final.</p> <p>Final – 20 shots deliberate, 20 shots time limit and one minute firing at a Skirmisher card at 25 metres.</p>
Targets	<p>1st, 2nd and 3rd Stages - Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)</p> <p>Final – 25 Metre Rifle (25M10BM) and Skirmisher (X5) targets</p>
Period of Shooting	Winter/Summer - October to August
Special Conditions	<p>Shooting of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd stages will be in accordance with arrangements made by County Associations. The 1st and 2nd stages will be scored by County Associations. The 3rd stage will be scored by a person appointed by the NSRA</p> <p>The 1st, 2nd and 3rd stages may be shot on competitors' home ranges. The County Team in the 3rd stage does not have to shoot on the same range or on the same day.</p>

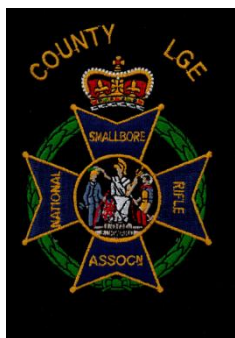

Eligibility	Category C Associations which are currently affiliated to the NSRA. Team members must reside in the County for which they shoot (NSRA Rule 3.3.1). Team members do not need to be individual members of the NSRA. Counties may enter more than one team.
Format	Teams of 5. League competition.
Course of Fire	10 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Team members must be aged 60 or over on the 31 st December in the year of entry.

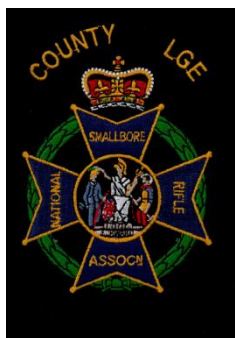

Format	Teams of 20. League competition.
Course of Fire	10 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April

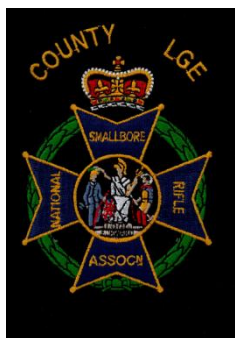

Format	Teams of 10. League competition.
Course of Fire	10 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	A county may not enter a team or teams in this league unless it has also entered a team in Competition 610.

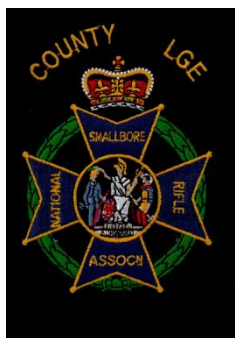

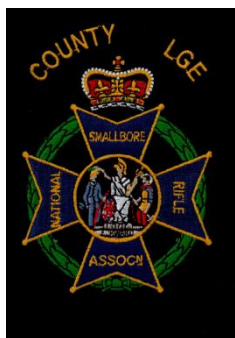

Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Competitors must be aged under 21 years on 31 st December of the year of entry

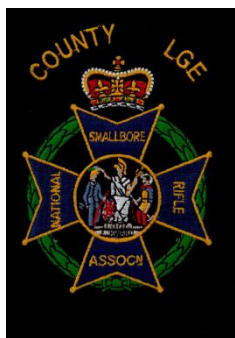

Course of Fire	10 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres per team member per round.

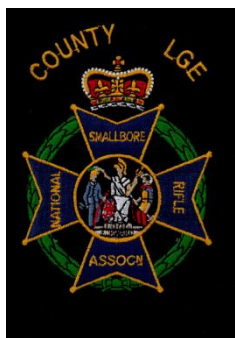

Conditions	
Eligibility	Category C Associations which are currently affiliated to the NSRA. Team members must reside in the County for which they shoot (NSRA Rule 3.3.1). Team members do not need to be individual members of the NSRA. Counties may enter more than one team.
Format	Teams of 3. League competition.
Course of Fire	30 shots per team member per round, 10 shots each prone, standing and kneeling at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres
Targets	Short Range Rifle (Prone - 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM ; Standing & Kneeling – 2005BM, 2505BM)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	The cards for each position may be fired on different days

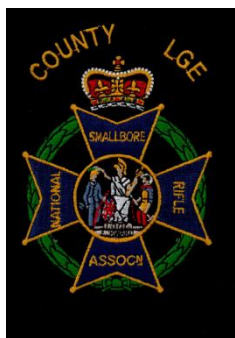

Course of Fire	20 shots standing at 20 yards or 25 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Free Pistol (PL14, PL14/06, PL19)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Any sights may be used

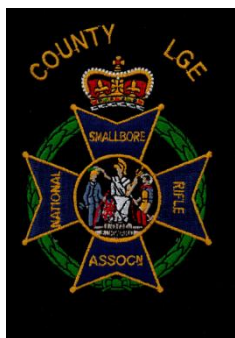

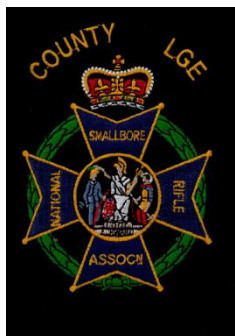
Conditions	
Eligibility	Category C Associations which are currently affiliated to the NSRA. Team members must reside in the County for which they shoot (NSRA Rule 3.3.1). Team members do not need to be individual members of the NSRA. Counties may enter more than one team.
Format	Teams of 5. League competition.
Course of Fire	30 shots at 10 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Air Rifle (Air 1, Air 2, Air 3/89, or any ISSF approved equivalent)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Rifles must conform to ISSF Rules. Match crossbows may be used instead of air rifles

Course of Fire	60 shots at 10 metres per team member.
Targets	Air Rifle (Air 1, Air 2, Air 3/89, or any ISSF approved equivalent)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Rifles must conform to ISSF Rules. Match crossbows may be used instead of air rifles

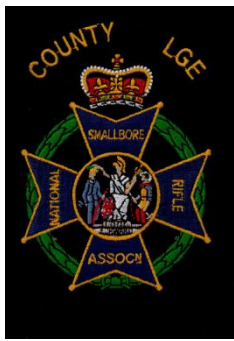


Conditions

Eligibility	Category C Associations which are currently affiliated to the NSRA. Team members must reside in the County for which they shoot (NSRA Rule 3.3.1). Team members do not need to be individual members of the NSRA. Counties may enter more than one team.
Format	Teams of 3. League competition for air pistol and/or air rifle shooters.
Course of Fire	20 shots at 10 metres per team member per round.
Targets	Air Pistol (Air 4/89) or Air Rifle (Air 1, Air 2, Air 3/89) as appropriate to the airgun being used. Equivalent electronic targets or ISSF approved airgun targets may also be used.
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	Team members must be under the age of 21 on 31 st December in the year of entry. Airguns must conform to ISSF Rules. Match crossbows may be used instead of air rifles.

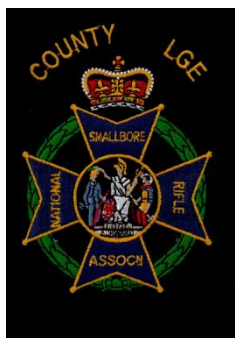

Special Conditions	0.177/0.22 air pistols may be used. Free pistols may be used.

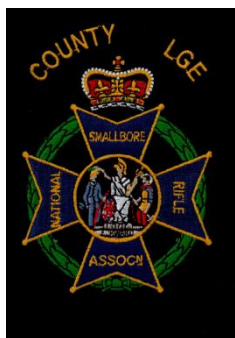

Targets	Slowfire pistol (PL15, PL15/09)
Period of Shooting	Winter – October to April
Special Conditions	0.177/0.22 air pistols may be used. Free pistols may be used.

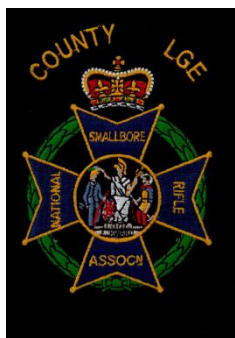

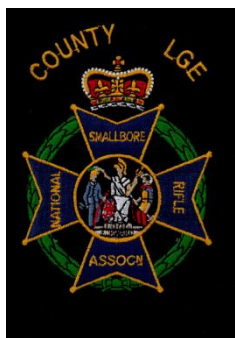

Targets	Short Range Benchrest (2010BR17, 2510BR15, 25M10BR15)
Period of Shooting	Winter - October to April
Special Conditions	All shooting must be in accordance with the NSRA rules for benchrest (Rule 8.16). See in particular the rules relating to the type of rest allowed (Rule 8.16.5).
